Beltane Picnic

Before enjoying a potluck meal together at Duck Creek Park on May 17th, Bill Hawthorne led the group in a Beltane ceremony. Traditionally bonfires were lit to honor the sun and to encourage the support of Bel and the Sun's light to nurture the emerging future harvest (Beltane originates from the Celtic god Bel meaning the bright one and the Gaelic for "teine" meaning fire). Everyone present was given a symbolic piece of wood to light and toss in the fire while stating his/her surname. Ty Thomson provided cake in remembrance of Chick and of their anniversary.



The bench is in the little park in the block where Thomsons live in Silvis. Chick always hit golf balls here and played soccer with the neighborhood kids. The city also planted a beautiful purple maple tree next to it. It's a lovely sight!
